CAMPUS MASTER SITE PLAN & ONE LEGACY INITIATIVE UPDATE

Be sure to stop by the ONE Legacy display today to see the brand new architectural renderings of Phase I of the Master Site Plan! This updated 3D fly around shows actual materials and colors with greater detail than previous conceptual renderings.



This past Wednesday and Thursday evening we hosted two important neighborhood gatherings to give our neighbors opportunity to weigh in on the proposed Phase I Master Site Plan. Invitations to these gatherings were made by going door to door to homes within a one to two block radius of our campus. The response from our neighbors so far has been very positive and conversations have focused on ensuring traffic flow on school drop off and pick up times is well thought out for the future - something we are already working on with the plans. We have great neighbors and we are thankful for dialogue as we work together for the future.

After a very positive preliminary hearing at the Rochester City Planning Council in early January, we are currently preparing to go back for site approval for all of Phase I in early March (a month later than anticipated). We have every reason to believe this will go very well based on the input we have received so far. Please note that we are seeking approval for the entire Phase I plan from the city in order to give our congregation an opportunity to make the final decision on the level of construction scope (up to the full Phase I construction) later this spring as was promised and voted on in the December meeting. Having full approval from the city ahead of time will allow us to also have more accurate cost estimates based on an actual approved plan prior to a final decision by our congregation, leveraging how much we are willing to finance to complete the project. While it is nothing short of amazing to realize the response to God's faithfulness as <u>so far</u> we have received pledges totaling over \$3,438,000 toward the ONE Legacy initiative, we are still prayerfully hopeful the Lord may continue to provide further pledges. Meanwhile multiple teams are working through projected future cost assessment and financial feasibility of the project—all in order to prepare us to best discern how to move forward in meeting the exciting growing ministry needs the Lord is bringing about! Please keep this exciting process in ongoing prayer.
