**SOUTH AFRICA MISSION- PLEASE PRAY!** Please keep Pastor Marc and David Halverson, our congregation chairman, in prayer as they leave this Monday on a ten-day mission trip to bring encouragement in Jesus' name to our new mission partner in Middelburg, South Africa. This

fall our St. John family was privileged to assist in funding \$20,000 (half the total installation cost) of a solar energy project on the St. Peter Lutheran Church and School campus in Middelburg that will assist in alleviating 80% of costs and freeing up more financial resources for educating over 850 students - many of whom live below the poverty level. This grant partnership is in addition to other capital improvements being made in Middelburg by *Here We Stand* funding through our Michigan District.

While there, Pastor Marc will have the honor of preaching at Pastor Mandla Khumalo's ministry anniversary service in worship next Sunday. Their group will also be visiting the main St. Peter campus as well as various ministry sites, the seminary and meeting with leaders to discuss transition plans as Pastor Khumalo prepares to come to the Michigan District with his family for a two-year period beginning later this year. Please keep all of this in prayer as we praise the Lord for this incredible opportunity to partner together in making an eternal difference in Jesus' name.
