

St. John Cross Country Girls' Team is National Champion! The St. John girl's cross country team was crowned 2018 National Champions at the National Cross Country Championships. The Meet was held last Saturday, October 20, at Concordia University in Mequon, WI. All 9 members of the girl's team, as well as 2 members from the boy's team, competed in Nationals against nearly 500 runners from around the country. This is the first National Championship for any athletic team at St. John Lutheran School. Although at the event the team was awarded Runner-Up, upon further review an error was detected, resulting in St. John as the

champion. The top five runners of the girls team were Madeleine Barge, Lily Myers, Abby Rice, Kendall Zaliwski, and Emma Burrell. In addition, several members of the team earned spots on the All-American Teams, including Madeleine Barge earning 2nd Team All-American honors (and 10th place overall in the meet!) and Abby Rice, Lily Myers and Henry Barge earning 3rd Team All-American honors. Many thanks to our amazing coaches, Mr. Todd Bauer and Mr. Paul Rice! A banner raising ceremony and celebration will be held soon. Congratulations and God's blessings to the whole team!

SOUTH AFRICA MISSION TRIP UPDATE - Many thanks to all of you who shared your prayerful support and encouragement for Pastor Marc and our congregation Vestry chairman, Dave Halvorson as they traveled to spend time building relationships with our new mission partners in South Africa. They were struck by the pure joy of our Christian brothers and sisters in the face of many hardships and Spiritmotivated passion to share Jesus with their neighbors, community and world. It is a country of great contrasts between those who have and those who have not. While the lasting effects of apartheid and racial discrimination continue to be sorted out through local and national government, the reconciling power of forgiveness through the gospel of Jesus and His Church is truly winning the day.

While in Middelburg they toured the church and school (preschool-11th grade) campus where a \$20,000 portion of our ONE Legacy mission tithe funding will assist with the installation of solar energy panels for the future.
