# **SUNDAY CLASSES**

### THE BOOK OF GALATIANS

Pastor Gil McDonald Sundays 9:30-10:30 AM Concordia Hall Galatians is a letter of love addressed from Paul to congregations in Galatia. This is no romantic love letter from a longing lad, but the passionate/compassionate letter from a pastor to his troubled people. The letter seems to be as much from Paul's heart as his letter to the Romans is from his mind. As we read and study this letter together, we will see Paul as a loving spiritual leader, sick at heart that the people he nurtured in the faith have gone astray, angered at those who torment them with untruths and who lie about him, frustrated that his spiritual children cannot seem to cling to the Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ alone. It shines the Gospel clearly, brilliantly, like a jewel. Through it the Holy Spirit calls the Galatians, and us, back to Christ as the center of our faith.

As we study Galatians, our journey will take us through (1)Bad news vs. good news - i.e. we are sinful, condemned, and helpless to "fix" our situation but through faith we are made right with God by Jesus' sacrifice for us. (2) We will seek to understand the conflict with a group named Judaizers, and how they affected Paul's initial life changing message of salvation in Jesus alone. (3) We will view faith in the Old Testament alongside the New Testament people and see the same promise of Messiah's coming, giving salvation apart from works of the Law. (4) We will understand the need and use of the Law in our lives and God's gift of it, and our freedom from its curse because of faith in Jesus. (5) We will gain an understanding of what it means to be "sons of God" and the treasure of our freedom in Jesus. (6) We will look in depth at what it means to be "free in Christ" and what it means to "walk in the Spirit" in our daily lives. (7 & 8) We will look at Paul's final encouragements to the Galatians and us, to stand fast in the knowledge that we are not made right with God by what we do, but by faith in Jesus Christ. We will also tie up any remaining discussions.

### CITIZENS OF TWO KINGDOMS

This class is a 6-week DVD/Discussion series which discusses our roles in the Biblical teaching of the "Two Kingdoms": the "Kingdom of Grace" and the "Kingdom of Power", under which a Christian lives and functions.

Dr. Dale Meyer and Rev. Greg Seltz, distinguished Lutheran theologians, will address these questions: What are these kingdoms, How can Christians serve both, How do they intersect, Why America is NOT a Christian nation, In today's culture is our Government encroaching on our religious freedoms? If so, how does a Christian respond? Class runs January 8 - February 12.

## THE JEWISH ROOTS OF CHRISTIANITY / EXPLORING THE JEWISH ROOTS OF JESUS
